ICD-USA Section Foundation Message from the President



The Board of Trustees (BOT) had a very productive meeting in San Diego on April 15, 2015. The meeting was held during the semi-annual Spring Meeting of the USA Section. I thank our BOT for their hard work and extend a special thanks to all of you for your generous support of the USA Section Foundation.

The **Century Club** was launched last year with invitations to the Board of Regents and the Board of Trustees and both have responded with 100% support. It is now being introduced to all of our US Fellows. These funds will provide additional revenue to support the humanitarian and educational projects of the Section and the Foundation.

Century Club Fellows will be included in the Lathrop and Shaffer Memorial Funds when those donation levels are reached. They will receive a Lathrop Stamp Collection while supplies last and a Shaffer Memorial Coin. Fellows will be included on a Century Club Plaque in the Foundation Office and will be listed in the **KEY**, and on the website. Century Club Fellows will also receive a distinctive recognition pin. The Foundation has agreed to sponsor a motivational speaker for the new Fellows and their families prior to the **Fellowship Orientation Program** (FOP). Our first presenter will be Dr. Robert Frazer, who will speak on **"Life,** **Leadership, and Legacy.**" Dr. Frazer is a Fellow of the International College of Dentists, an expert on Applied Strategic Planning, and a national and international lecturer.

Dr. Frank Serio will receive the **ADA Humanitarian of the Year Award** at the Opening Session of the ADA in Washington, DC. The Foundation will contribute \$5000 toward his award, which will be used to help fund his Dominican Republic Mission Program. Dr. Serio started this program over 33 years ago and lectures extensively for the Section's Program on Volunteerism in Dentistry, which is funded by the Foundation.

The ADA will hold a **Mission of Mercy** in Washington, DC following the ADA Meeting. We are proud that so many Fellows give generously of their time and talents to treat these deserving patients. The Foundation is contributing \$1000 in support of this event.

The BOT has approved the new position of **Foundation Ambassador** to develop relationships with our corporate colleagues and secure future financial support for the Section and the Foundation. Dr. Jack Clinton will serve as our first Ambassador. Dr. Clinton is the Dean Emeritus of OHSU Dental School, a Past President of the USA Section, and has chaired a very successful fundraising effort for the new Oregon Dental School.

The **Student Humanitarian Award** was offered for the first time at US Dental Schools. The Award parallels the Student Leadership Award. This USA Section Award may be given to a senior Dental Student who best exemplifies altruistic leadership in promoting and supporting humanitarian efforts in the USA and throughout the world. We thank Dr. Bill Hunter for supporting this program for 10 years with his generous donation of \$28,000.
