Although I didn't fully appreciate what Fellowship meant, I quickly responded by scheduling a flight to Las Vegas to accept this great honor. I reviewed the registration details on the flight and wondered why I needed to attend an orientation meeting. I arrived promptly, entered a grand ballroom and was greeted by Pennsylvania's Regent, Dr. Linda Himmelberger, saw some of my local Philadelphia friends who were also being honored with Fellowship and was pleasantly surprised to see several other Fellow-elect friends from all over the country.

Ken Austin, the cofounder of Adec industries, gave the keynote address. We were then given a charge by USA Section ICD President Jack Clinton. One by one the names were read and as the twelve of us from District 3 crossed the stage, and received our Keys and Certificates, the organ played the Pennsylvania Waltz.

We all felt so fortunate to have been invited into this Fellowship. And although our time together was short it would always be a ceremony to remember.
