The ICD's International Student Exchange Committee, chaired by Regent W. Michael Kenney has just completed a new Manual for Program Organization and Implementation, designed to encourage and facilitate expanded Exchange participation among US dental schools and their foreign counterparts. The ICD's USA Section has printed the Manual and distributed it to the Regencies.

Dental Schools that will be "World Class" in the global community of the 21st Century must respond to more than traditional academic challenges of past years. They also must endow students with an appreciation for issues of global health and prepare them for professional leadership and contribution to oral health in the world-at-large. The ICD's International Student Exchange is one important step on the path to the future of dentistry in the community of nations.

For many years, students at University of Maryland's Dental School and their foreign partner institutions have benefited from the professional and cultural enrichment this reciprocal Exchange program adds to their education. Additionally, Maryland's Global Outreach Program annually arranges 2-week reciprocal Foreign Dental Externships for Senior Dental Students who select exchange opportunities from among 15 schools in 12 countries. Approximately 25 percent of the Senior Class participated in the current academic year, visiting dental schools in Ireland, Mexico, Peru, Korea, and Vietnam. Interest in global dentistry is high among all students. Freshmen, Sophomores, and Juniors often volunteer to participate in humanitarian overseas dental missions during their vacation periods.

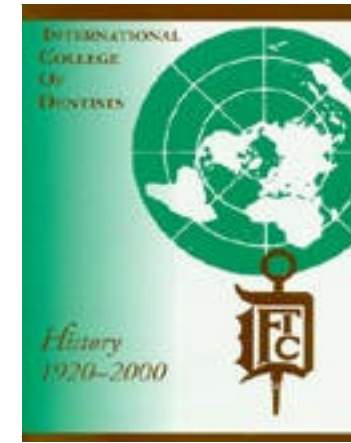

The purpose of the International College of Dentists is to perpetuate the history of dentistry by recognizing those individuals, who have, by their actions, demonstrated conspicuous and meritorious service to the profession, their community, and their family. Any member, in good standing, may "Sponsor" a dentist within his or her local constituent for Fellowship.

The fill-in "Forms" necessary for the fellowship process may be electronically downloaded as a Adobe PDF file from this website and may be completed on your computer screen, then printed out; or they may be printed out as blank forms and then filled in by typewriter. They are the Sponsor Form and the Candidate Form. Handwritten copies are not acceptable, except for signature. The blank forms can be downloaded, easily typed into on your computer, and then must be immediately printed (They can not be saved with the information filled in) so they can then be sent in via mail.

STEP #1 — MOST IMPORTANT !!

Please submit the name of the candidate to the Deputy Regent for the Constituent. The Deputy Regent will submit the name to the screening committee for the purpose of determining if the candidate is a member in good standing in the American Dental Association and has been a member of the dental profession for a minimum of five years. Upon receiving a favorable response, the process may continue.
