Bylaw Change International College of Dentists USA Section

An interesting and valuable change for many members!

Section 6 – Disabled Membership

- a. A member of the Section forced to retire from practice, research, administering or teaching of Dentistry due to a disabling medical problem or extenuating circumstance may be eligible for Disabled Membership.
- b. If such disabled member returns to practice, research, administering or teaching of dentistry, the member shall be reclassified to their previous class of membership upon the member's notification to the Registrar of such a change.
- c. Disabled Members are exempt from the payment of dues assessments and shall retain the right to vote or hold office, and to propose, sponsor, or endorse candidates for fellowship.

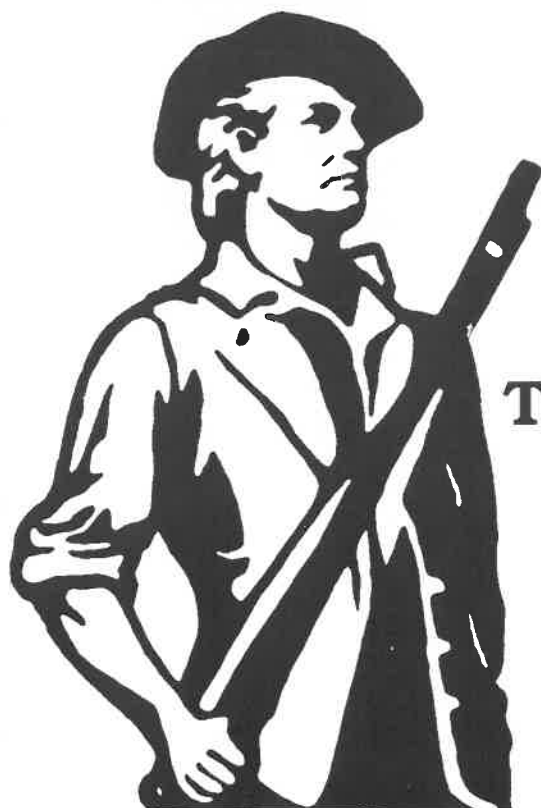
Gene has served ICD as a Deputy

A Man of Dedication

John T. Reifke was not a little wheel, but rather a big cog in the wheel that moved the USA Section of the International College of Dentists to new heights of financial security. A most truly dedicated servant to our organization, John served twenty years as our Treasurer. His tenure ended in 1989 as he was named Treasurer Emeritus of the USA Section, ICD. He is the only officer ever to serve that long, which sets a standard of service for the ICD. Through these years of dedication he earned the honor and respect of all those who had the privilege of working with him.

Fellow Reifke has too many capacities to enumerate. One of his many desirable traits is his earnest sincerity. Subterfuge and camouflage have no place in his dealings. A spade is a spade, and he calls it so. A burning determination to succeed in his role as Treasurer was evident in his every action. A quiet man, bursts of humor frequently brought smiles on the faces of his listeners.

In 1928 he was invited into membership in the Cleveland Dental Society and at that time he made an important decision. He selected dentistry over the Knights of Columbus as the arena for his forte. His many accomplishments in dentistry attest to the wisdom of that decision.

John was inducted into ICD in 1952 and in 1969 was elected Treasurer of our organization. At this time he made another important decision. He was serving as Regent Lloyd Phillips' Vice Regent. As he expresses it "he had no desire to go up the ladder" in ICD so consequently resigned his Vice Regency. Although serving in important capacities in the Ohio Dental Association and the ADA his decision to transfer his energy and concentration to the office of Treasurer contributed immeasurably to the success he achieved. Trying to earn as much interest as possible with safety paramount became an obsession. John Reifke during his tenure, with his unique abilities, produced an amazing portfolio and a sound base for the ICD.

The quality of his leadership has been recognized by others as well. John was President of the Cleveland Dental Society in 1954-55 and of the Ohio Dental Association in 1963. He was a delegate or alternate delegate to the Ohio House of Delegates for fifteen years and a delegate or alternate delegate to the ADA House of Del-

egates for nearly 20 years. John served six years on the ADA Council on Insurance. He was the local arrangements Publicity Chairman for the 1940 ADA Annual Session in Cleveland and the 1953 ADA meetings' Publicity Chairman.

In 1971, John received a special Citation from the Cleveland Dental Society. The Pierre Fauchard Academy presented its Distinguished Service Award to John in 1977. The Ohio Dental Association's Distinguished Dentist was given in 1978. In 1981 he was given the Distinguished Alumnus Award from Case Western University School of Dentistry and in 1989 the International College of Dentists gave him its Award of Merit.

John's interest and energy in dentistry has never faltered. As a member of Omicron Kappa Upsilon he has continued to uphold the highest standards of education. Still in active practice at nearly fourscore and ten he probably earns more Continuing Education credits each year than 95% of the dentists half his age. Within the past year he has earned 33 hours of credit. He has been a constant attendee at the Chicago Mid-Winter meeting for the last 38 years and has attended most of the ICD Continuing Education Conferences.

Into his hobby of gardening, John puts the same serious enthusiasm as he puts into his dental activities and with the same success. John says this helps him keep his head on. On his 15 acre farm he enjoys the fun of planting and seeing things grow. He presently farms 66 fruit trees, blueberries, currants, raspberries, seven flower gardens and a grove of 16 trees of Carpathian Walnuts, Japanese

Hazelnuts and Buarte Nuts.

Tribute must be paid to John's chief support, practice co-worker and wife Mildred. She has been with him in his dental practice throughout these years but has been active in dentistry in her own area. Mildred served in several capacities at the national level in the American Auxiliary to the ADA.

Mildred and John have parented three lovely daughters and now have 17 grandchildren that call them "Poppy" and "Nana".

To a dedicated servant and for ICD we can only say "Thank you , John, for a job well done."

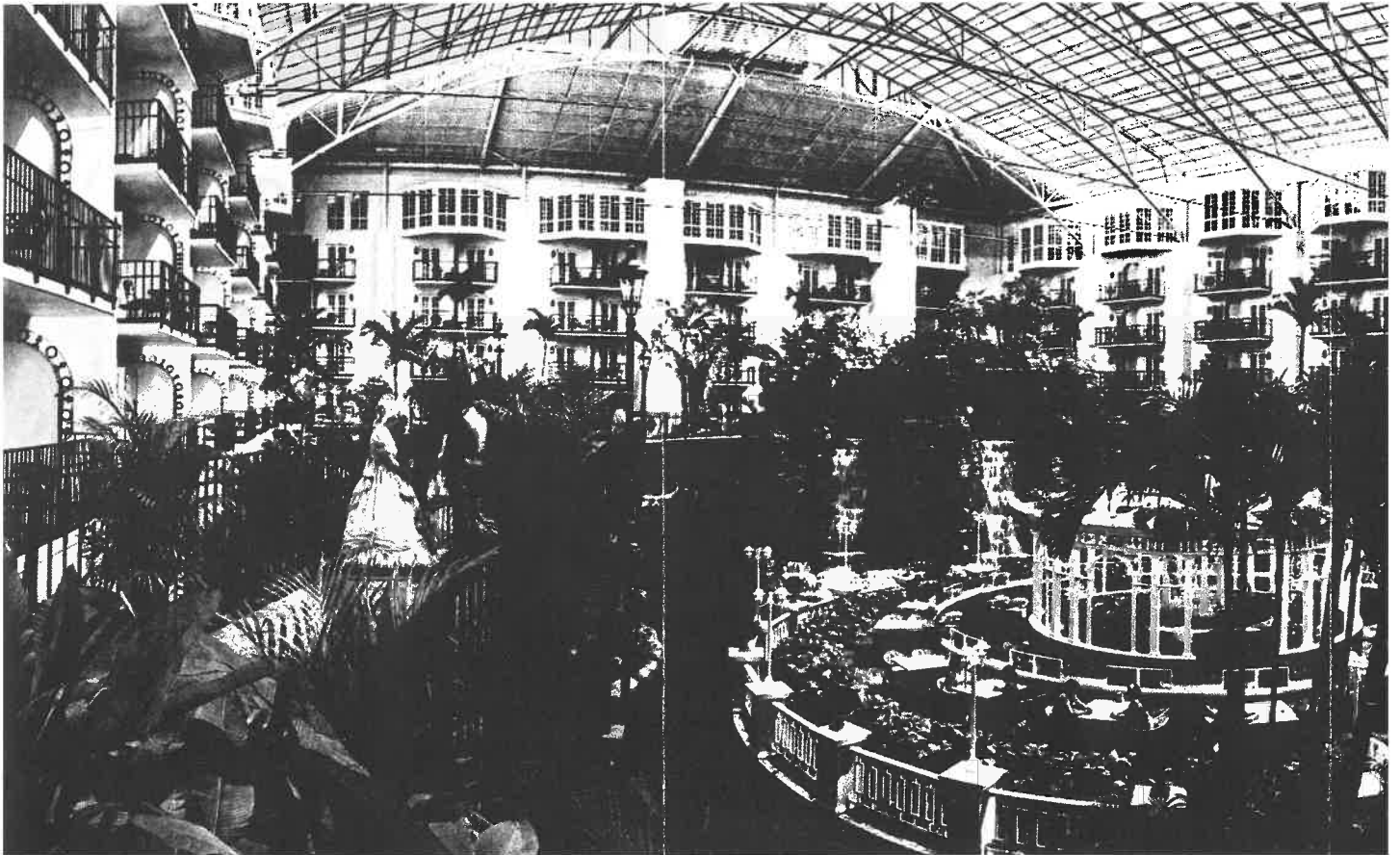

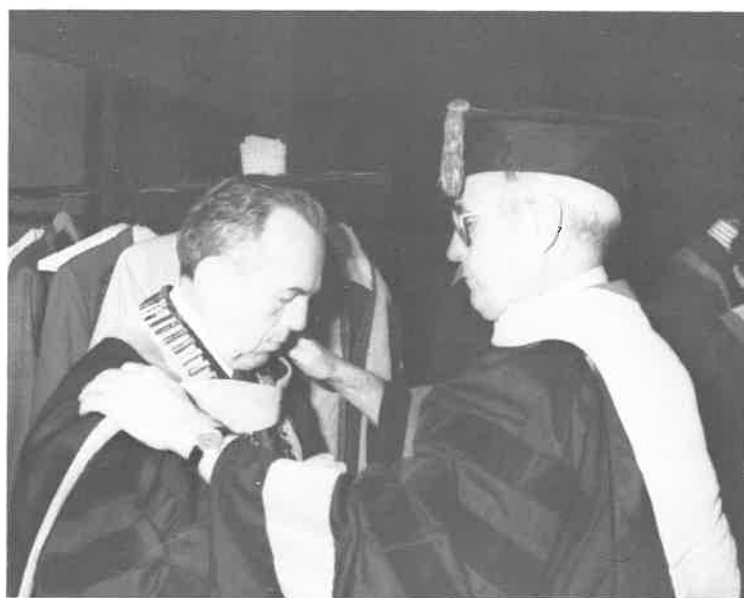
