often ponder the meaning of success in dentistry. Is it our ability to provide outstanding care for our patients? We've all had patients look in the mirror and smile when they see a fractured incisor beautifully restored. A patient may regain function when a long missing tooth is replaced by implant or prothesis. We

all have dental skills which permit us to perform near miracles on our patients. It often isn't easy to extract a difficult impacted third molar or treat a scared child.

Is it the amount of money we earn enabling us to provide a comfortable home, raise children, vacation, and educate our families? We've invested a lot of time and money in our dental education and certainly deserve some reward for our investment.

Success involves learning leadership skills which provide the foundation for developing an enduring, productive dental team. Without caring staff members and colleagues, it is difficult to have a successful dental practice.

While all the above measures of success are important, a simple act of thanks brings me the greatest satisfaction in dentistry.

I remember the first MOM-n-PA held in Philadelphia in 2013. An incredible weariness had descended upon me after spending thirteen hours at the Liacouras Center. As volunteers left, I tried to personally thank everyone for donating their time and talents. An endodontist who I barely knew called me over to thank the MOM-n-PA organizers. He said he had just had the greatest day of his dental career treating patients he had never met before. He told me patients in his private office complain if they must wait ten minutes for their appointments, and he rarely gets a thank you for a completed root canal. Here, he continued, patients had lined up before dawn often waiting hours for care. Each patient expressed sincere gratitude for having their endodontic treatment completed. Never had he received so many hugs and thanks.

I too find it rewarding treating the underserved and uninsured at Community Volunteers in Medicine (CVIM) in West Chester, PA. The team of dentists, assistants, hygienists, and interpreters all provide great care to our patients, many of whom are Hispanic. Having treated only one French speaking patient in my life, I often wonder why I took four years of French in high school and college. What was I thinking? I guess I was expecting a glorious trip to Paris and a trip up the Eiffel Tower. Spanish would have been immensely more valuable in communicating with my patients at CVIM. Over the past four years I have picked up some extremely basic Spanish dental terms, but I am reliant on my Spanish speaking assistants or interpreter to help with medical histories, gather symptoms, inform patients of proposed treatment, and gain informed consent. Thank you, Luz, Matt, and Rosie!

Despite the communication difficulties, every patient shows gratitude for the care the CVIM staff and I provide. Just as I say "Hola" or "Hello" when they arrive, every patient leaves with a smile and a "Thank you" for their dental care.

I hope that each of you can find a volunteer experience that brings you the joy of helping others whether in the dental field or your community. Please join me at MOM-n-PA at the York Expo Center on June 10 and 11 or travel to the Mission of Mercy Pittsburgh on August 5 and 6. Each of us have learned an incredible set of skills during our dental careers and receiving a heartfelt "Thank you" can be the greatest sign of success.

He is President and General Chair of MOM-n-PA dental missions since 2011 and has helped guide this extraordinary effort through eight missions. He and his colleagues are hard at work preparing for the ninth free dental mission this summer in York. Dr. Davis has been a member of the Rotary Club of Shippensburg since 1999, serving two terms as its president during that time. He has been a head coach for both youth volleyball and basketball teams. And for the past 23 years he has been involved in international dental missions, including serving as Dental Director for Ecuadent Dental Missions.
