The Hands, The Head, and The Heart

Reflections on Practicing Dentistry for Over 34 Years

In October 2018, at 60 years of age, I retired after practicing dentistry for over 34 years, 28 of them in solo private practice in Wolfeboro, NH. The reason I retired was two-fold. The first reason was that I had reached financial security and could retire. (Like most dentists, I started out my career with significant student loan debt.) The second reason I retired was that I had a burning desire to teach other dentists how to be happy and financially successful in dentistry. Early in my practice years I was fortunate to learn that in order to be a successful dentist, I had to get my "thinking" right and not only utilize "my Hands," but I had to use "my Head," and "my Heart" as well.

Regarding "my Hands," I always strived for technical excellence and was always a student. For me, "quality was not a variable." Early in my career, I took all the classes taught by Dr. Peter Dawson and at the Pankey Institute. In the early to mid 90s, I was traveling to Florida, 2 to 3 times a year for continuing education. At Pankey, my "aha" moment was when I learned that dentistry was more than just teeth. I learned about the Cross of Dentistry, a philosophy explaining that happiness and financial success in dentistry came first from "knowing yourself" followed by "knowing your patient, knowing your work, and applying your knowledge." For me, constantly learning new philosophies and techniques made the practice of dentistry challenging, fun and exciting

When I refer to using "my Head," I am referring to the management of my practice and to my personal finances. Examples of how I used my "head" included having good policies and systems in place regarding scheduling or collections. It referred to how I problem solved, worked with my team, saved for future equipment purchases or leasehold improvements, or how I paid for my three daughters' college educations. It referred to budgeting and marketing. Essentially, the "Head" referred to anything having to do with management. To educate myself in this area, over the years, I worked with three different practice management companies, each one different, each one worth the investment, and each one helpful in their own special way.

Lastly, when I think about my career success, the biggest contributor was how I utilized "the Heart." Essentially, using my heart referred to my three passions: passion for my patients, pas-

All dentists need to educate staff, patients, family, and friends about how important this critical problem is worldwide and promote how everyone shares in the responsible use of antibiotics. We are approaching

what is being referred to as the "Post-Antibiotic Era or Apocalypse", where antibiotics are not effective.
