editor's report

ADA Library and Cannabis at AADEJ

Your editor attended the annual conference of the American Association of Dental Editors and Journalists on September 3-4, 2019. We began with a full afternoon session on evidenced based dentistry with Dr. Michael Glick, JADA editor, and Dr. Alonso Carrasco-Labra, of ADA's evidence synthesis. Both doctors reviewed the fundamental designs of clinical studies and the key statistical aspects when reporting the studies' results. We were alerted to common fallacies in drawing conclusions from some studies, such as claims of equivalence despite reported differences that are not clinically significant. Dr. Glick pointed out the difference in value of relative vs. absolute risk.

Heidi Nickisch Duggan and Kelly O'Brien, of the ADA Library and Archives, led us through the steps of increasing the visibility of healthcare articles. The intricate indexing of MEDLINE and archiving at NBLM, national library of medicine, are examples. Michelle Hoffman, VP of Publishing at the ADA, explained misconceptions and problems dealing with both digital and print media. For instance, it is impractical to mix digital with print information in your communication with your members. Barry Taylor, professor at Oregon School of Dentistry, was informative and fascinating with his presentation of "Cannabis, Opioids, Pyramids, and Statistics" about the physiology of cannabis. For the first time, I understood the difference between CBD, the non-psychoactive component, and THC, the psycho-active component of cannabis. ADA Executive Director Mary O'Loughlin gave us a frank review of the current issues at ADA.
