istrict III was very active this past year hosting a reception in March 2019 at the Greater Philadelphia Valley Forge Dental Conferenced in conjunction with the Philadelphia Delaware Valley Section of the American College

of Dentists and the Pierre Fauchard Academy. ICD Student Leadership and Humanitarian Awards were presented at each of the three Pennsylvania dental schools. These six individuals are truly outstanding members of our profession, as you can tell by reading the bio sketches of four of the recipients located elsewhere in this issue of *The College Call*.

Continuing its emphasis on Humanitarian efforts, many District III Fellows participated in the 2019 MOM-n-PA event held in Wilkes-Barre, PA. Volunteers provided \$1,196,306 of dental care and over 1,900 patient visits. District III has supported MOM-n-PA since its inception in 2013. To date, over seven missions, MOM-n-PA has completed 42,428 procedures on 10,790 patients. The total value of dental care provided by 7,412 volunteers is \$6,402,506. This year's event will be held at the Liacouras Center, 1776 North Broad Street Philadelphia on June 5th and 6th, 2020.

The 2019 Convocation was held in San Francisco, CA. Dr. Peter P. Korch, Ill as President, ICD USA Section, presided over the Convocation. Peter, of Woodland, PA, a second-generation dentist followed his father in practice. He has a passion for music, especially when played on vinyl, as well as an inordinate fondness for British motorcars. He and his wife, Elizabeth Morgan, VMD, live on a farm where tending gardens and caring for their animals is a labor of love.

Every time you volunteer your time or resources you are doing something for ICD. The Fellows of the International College of Dentists were chosen because of what they did and what they are doing daily: *Integrity Leadership Service*. Doing something for ICD does not get any more complicated that that.

When Drs. Louis Ottofy and Tsurukichi Okumura first came up with the idea to create the International College of Dentists in 1920, likely they never imagined that the inaugural number of 250 fellows would swell to more than 12,000 fellows in 122 countries.

The ICD will celebrate those numbers in 2020 during 100th anniversary celebrations throughout the world and throughout the year, culminating at the 2020 meeting of the International Council in Nagoya, Japan, in November with an international induction ceremony, gala banquet and other commemorative events.

The idea for the International College of Dentists was conceived in Japan in 1920 at a farewell party for Dr. Ottofy, a Hungarian dentist living and having been educated in the U.S., said Dr. S. Dov Sydney, ICD international editor and director of global communications as well as general chair of the worldwide centennial committee.

Dr. Ottofy left the United States to practice dentistry in the Philippines and Japan for 23 years. When he was returning to the U.S., his Japanese colleague, Dr. Okumura, urged Dr. Ottofy to form an international organization of outstanding dentists to create and maintain professional collegiality and friendships, monitor and evaluate the progress of dentistry internationally and disseminate such information to dental colleagues in all countries of the world, Dr. Sydney said.

While U.S. fellows might not be able to travel to Nagoya to participate in the centennial celebration,

they can join in the fun during the ADA FDC Annual Meeting in Orlando, FL, October 13th – 16th. The U.S.A. section will hold their annual meeting at the Waldorf Astoria Orlando Hotel in the Bonnet Creek area. The 2020 Convocation will be on October 16th. Plans are underway for the centennial celebration dinner in one of the Disney World theme parks on Oct. 16, and there

will also be a centennial golf tournament at the Lake Buena Vista Golf Course on Oct. 17.

I would extend a heartfelt thanks to Dr. James M. Boyle III of York, PA who is serving as your

Vice-Regent and Dr. Ron Heier of Malvern, PA who is serving as your Deputy Regent, for their assistance this past year.

Dr. Heier was chosen as the recipient of the 2020 Pennsylvania Dental Association's Distinguished Service Award in recognition of his leadership and service to the dental profession at the local, state and national level. The award was to be presented on April 24th during the Pennsylvania

Dental Association Meeting which has been cancelled because of the COVID-19 pandemic.
