The Section will present its Journalism Awards honoring Dental Editors from all over the USA at the luncheon.


TOURS:

We have always stressed the fact that we want quality, not quantity. With that in mind, let me review the process we ask you to use to nominate a candidate for Fellowship. First, contact your Deputy Regent. He will advise you of the Screening procedures for your state, and following approval by the Screening Committee, he will furnish you an Information Form for your candidate. Remove the Endorsement Sheet before asking your candidate to fill in the form completely. Questions have been devised to provide the information we seek, and space should be ample for pertinent answers. When complete, forward this form with the endorsement sheet and supporting letters from two or three other Fellows to your Deputy Regent. He will see that it is signed by the Counselor and Regent and sent to the Central Office where the candidate's information is condensed and mailed to the Board of Regents for final ballot. The sponsor is notified of his candidate's acceptance around the time of the annual meeting when the next year's Class takes shape. Remember, we are now working on the Class of 1987 as 1986 is complete.

A new Roster will be published in 1986, so please keep us informed of any changes that may occur in your address.


